

The Maryland HCUP State Inpatient Databases (SID) for 2006-2009 contain problems with the coding of discharge disposition (DISPuniform). Transfers to other acute care hospitals are misidentified as transfers to other health facilities.

The source-provided patient disposition codes for the following were erroneously mapped to transfer to other health care facility (DISPuniform=5) instead of being mapped to transfer to an acute care hospital (DISPuniform=2):

- From another acute care hospital (DISP X=40)
- Acute care unit from on-site rehabilitation (DISP_X = 21)
- Acute care unit from chronic care unit (DISP_X = 25).

This error resulted in the 2006 MD SID having an unusually small number of records associated with transfers to an acute care hospital and, in the 2007-2009 MD SID, there were no records marked as transfers to an acute care hospital. The table below indicates the number of affected records.

If you are using the discharge disposition for data analysis, please recode the records with $DISP_X = 21, 25$, and 40 to DISPuniform = 2.
