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### INTRODUCTION

This document provides an overview of how the Healthcare Cost and Utilization Project (HCUP) 2016 Nationwide Emergency Department Sample (NEDS) has changed in file structure (as compared with the 2015 NEDS) and resumes a format similar to those prior to 2015.

The NEDS was designed to produce national and regional estimates about emergency department (ED) visits across the country. Information includes geographic characteristics, hospital characteristics, patient characteristics, and the nature of visits (e.g., common diagnoses for ED visits). The NEDS was constructed using the HCUP State Emergency Department Databases (SEDD) and the State Inpatient Databases (SID). The SEDD capture discharge information on ED visits that do not result in an admission (i.e., treat-and-release visits and transfers to another hospital). The SID contain information on patients initially seen in the ED and then admitted to the same hospital.

As a result of the introduction of ICD-10-CM/PCS<sup>1</sup> on October 1, 2015 (at the start of fiscal year 2016), the United States transitioned from using ICD-9-CM to ICD-10-CM/PCS code sets for reporting clinical diagnoses and inpatient procedures. Beginning with the 2015 NEDS, the names of diagnosis- and procedure-related data elements under ICD-10-CM/PCS have been changed to identify the coding scheme. Because of the change in diagnosis and procedure coding, the 2015 NEDS included nine months of data with ICD-9-CM coding and three months of data with ICD-10-CM/PCS coding.

In contrast, the 2016 NEDS is an annual, calendar year file with diagnosis and procedure codes reported using only the ICD-10-CM/PCS coding system. Therefore, the file structure of the 2016 NEDS is similar to the file structure of the NEDS in data years prior to 2015 with one exception: Data elements derived from AHRQ software tools are not available in the 2016 NEDS because the ICD-10-CM/PCS versions of these tools are still under development. For users interested in applying the AHRQ software tools to the ICD-10-CM/PCS data in the 2016 NEDS, beta versions of the AHRQ software tools are available for download on the <u>HCUP Tools</u> & <u>Software section</u> of the HCUP User Support (HCUP-US) Web site. This document outlines the revised file structure of the HCUP NEDS in 2016 and provides resources to aid HCUP data users in using these files and data elements based on ICD-10-CM/PCS codes.

# REVISED FILE STRUCTURE OF THE 2016 NATIONWIDE EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT SAMPLE

The 2016 NEDS includes three discharge-level files and one-hospital level file:

- Discharge-level Files
  - Core File is a single file containing commonly used data elements (e.g. age, expected primary payer, ICD-10-CM diagnosis codes, total charges for ED services).
    - The difference in 2016 from years 2014 and prior is that it does not contain the following data elements derived from ICD-10-CM diagnosis codes: Clinical Classification Software categories (I10\_DXCCSn, I10\_ECAUSECCSn), chronic condition indicators (I10\_CHRONn), and injury flags (I10\_INJURY, I10\_MULTINJURY).
  - **Supplemental ED File** is a single file containing data elements specific to ED visits that do not results in an admission to the same hospital.
    - The difference in 2016 from years 2014 and prior is that it does not contain the following data elements based on ICD-10-PCS procedure codes: procedure codes (I10\_PR\_EDn), Clinical Classification Software categories of procedures (I10\_PRCCS\_EDn) and procedure class (I10\_PCLASS\_EDn). ICD-10-PCS procedure codes are not included on the ED supplemental file because this coding system was designed for procedure coding on inpatient data. The ED supplemental file includes Physicians' Current Procedural Terminology (CPT) codes.
  - **Supplemental Inpatient File** is a single file containing data elements specific to ED visits that result in an admission to the same hospital.
    - The difference in 2016 from years 2014 and prior is that it does not contain the following data elements derived from ICD-10-PCS procedure codes: Clinical Classification Software categories of procedures (I10\_PRCCS\_IPn) and procedure class (I10\_PCLASS\_IPn).
- Hospital Weights File is a single file containing information on hospital characteristics.

A complete list of discontinued data elements in the 2016 NEDS is available in Appendix A.

These recommendations apply to calendar year 2015 data (which includes both ICD-9-CM and ICD-10-CM/PCS codes), as well as reporting trends that span the October 1, 2015 transition date (before and after the introduction of ICD10-CM/PCS).

Users will also learn how to verify that the Tool has loaded correctly.

Appendix A includes a complete list of discontinued data elements on the 2016 NEDS. This list includes data elements derived from AHRQ software tools as well as additional data elements that rely on ICD-10-CM/PCS coding in the definition of one or more values (e.g., I10\_INJURY and I10\_MULTINJURY).
